### Newark Book Festival by Bea Sampson, Y4

On Sunday 14th July, I went to Newark Book Festival. At the event, three authors were there. They were Thomas Taylor, Michelle Harrison, and Elly Griffiths.

To start the event, each of the authors read an extract from their books. Michelle read from her book 'A Pinch of Magic', Elly from her debut young adult book 'A Girl Called Justice' and Thomas read from 'Malamander'. Next, a girl called Kezzy interviewed the authors.
